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TRACTS TO HAITI & DOMINICAN REPUBLIC



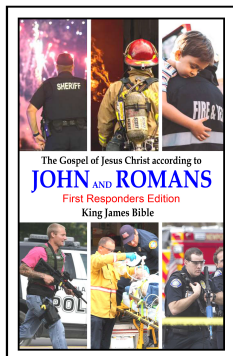
Kevin and Emelie Falde

Kevin and Emelie Falde are graduates of Pensacola Christian College and are missionaries to Haiti and the Dominican Republic. They have been instrumental in planting twenty-five churches and working to train national pastors. They are also involved in a medical ministry as well as a children's home and school. Bro. Falde visited us this past July and took with him 40,000 gospel tracts in Haitian Creole (10,000 each of four different titles) and 10,000 in Spanish for the Dominican Republic. A LETTER FROM INSIDE A NC PRISON

"I just recently rededicated my life to Christ after I overdosed and was brain dead for two days. Also on the same day, 7 hours later, I lost my 19 year old daughter in a car accident. A month later I cut my wrist to the bone trying to kill myself because it was too much to handle. Every time I closed my eyes after the suicide attempt, the Lord kept telling me that I was not alone, that He was with me, that He loved me and all I needed to do was pray!!! I dropped down on my knees, cried and talked to God like He was my very best friend...and He is!!! Now I am a prayer warrior and I have a new job. I go around this cell-block and tell guys about how Christ gave His life to save them. Hands down, it is the best job I've ever had. Praise God! I don't know how or if I would have made it through my daughter's death without our Lord and Savior carrying me when I was too weak to walk by myself. The reason for this letter is that I was walking around the cell-block at the prison and came across this little pamphlet titled, "Which Way?"...I would love to hear back from you at Hope Tract Ministry." 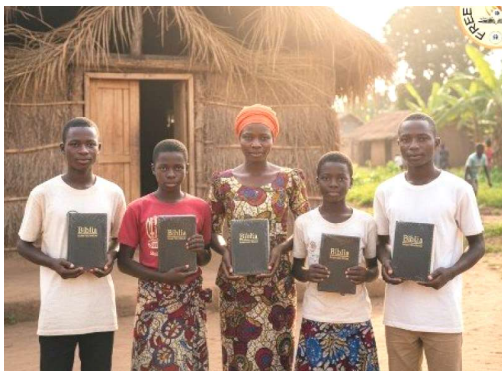

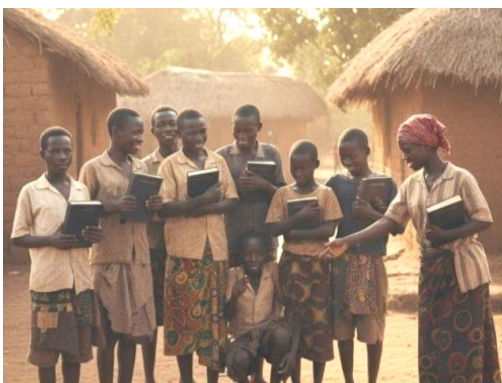


MAMA MWENGIE
